Open to oncology fellows and finishing fellows

The Global Resource for Advancing Cancer Education (GRACE; cancergrace.org) is a non-profit organization founded by leading Thoracic Oncologist, [Dr. Howard \(Jack\) West](#), in 2007. *GRACE's mission is to provide expert-mediated information directly to cancer patients and their caregivers to empower them to become direct partners in their cancer treatment.*

GRACE Patient Education Ambassadors Program Overview

This nomination-only program is open to all oncology fellows and finishing-fellows. GRACE's designated committee will review the nominees and select up to 4 participants for the honor of participating in the 2022 program. Nominees for this program will include those still in fellowship as well as those embarking on their post-fellowship junior faculty or practice positions; however, it is required that they are still a fellow at the time of the deadline, March 31, 2022.

Benefits of Participation

Selected fellows will work closely with national and international leaders in various fields of oncology to develop new educational content for patients across a range of platforms that will help them become established emerging contributors in their fields of interest. They will receive training on digitally distributed content and social media, and their work will be highlighted and shared by the internationally recognized non-profit, GRACE, along with its network of established leaders in the oncology community and board members with an array of interests and connections. Participants will receive a stipend which will include a technology package and paid training in doctor-to-patient/family and broader communication in the field. These benefits are achieved through regular (approximately every 4-6 weeks) virtual meetings moderated by GRACE.

Now entering the 4th year of this program, we have engaged with 10 oncology fellows, producing content in a diverse array of areas such as supportive care, Latino Community Cancer Education, breast cancer education, COVID-19 education, radiation oncology and clinical trials

information to name just a few. Content produced through this program has reached tens of thousands of cancer patients and caregivers.
